

#### **City Tours**

The blood-curdling screams of prisoners can be heard from the dungeon in the city tower and dubious characters scurry around in the shadows of the night. Many a visitor's blood runs cold, but the night watchman continues unperturbed in the light of his lantern, ensuring law and order.



### Museums, Exhibitions and Visitor Centres

The small plates holding exquisite pralines and crisp chocolate neapolitans go round on the conveyor belt. Skewers bearing colourful pieces of fruit are waiting to be dipped in the sweet chocolate fountain. The Chocolat Frey Visitor Centre invites you to enjoy a delicious taste experience and make surprising discoveries in the world of chocolate.

There is a lot of loud giggling to be heard when children generate energy on the slide in the Umwelt Arena Schweiz. But you will only hear the squeaking of tyres when Segways, e-bikes and electric vehicles compete on the indoor run. This is where subjects such as sustainability, renewable energy and nature can be experienced. From casting a church bell or making a straw hat through the history of tobacco down to the deep system of passageways under the town of Aarau, more than 70 museums and exhibition centres in Aargau open up their doors and gates. They take you on exciting journeys through time to long forgotten objects, crafts and languages.

Drilling for Salt

The five 17-metre high towers proudly rise from the ground. Up until 1970, people would drill here for salt and it was then that they discovered hot spring water. Today, they are landmarks of an important sector of industry in Aargau. There is a good reason why salt used to be counterbalanced by gold. Whether in nature, the kitchen, in medicine or in the winter on icy roads – our life is inextricably linked to this natural substance.

<u>Invention</u>

The History of Aluminium Foil

Everyone knows the soft rustle of shiny foil when a sandwich is unwrapped or a piece of tasty chocolate enjoyed.

On 15 April 1905 the patent for producing this well-known silver paper was awarded to Heinrich Alfred Gautschi from Aargau. The entrepreneur born in Menziken developed a rolling mill for what was referred to as a paper or book rolling procedure in his company. This involved rolling a thin sheet of aluminium, then dividing it into two halves, laying them on top of each other and rolling them again. The process was repeated until there was a package of 64 foil sheets. The new kind of foil was first used in particular for packaging, replacing tin which had been the metal of choice to date. From 1911 the company founded by the Swiss pioneer, Aluminiumwarenfabrik Gontenschwil AG, started producing other products made from aluminium.

Aargau is and always has been an innovative canton. Today this can be seen from the numerous inventions from the past, as well as in modern locations such as the PSI, Park Innovaare and the Hightech Zentrum.

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

visit you from abroad. You think about what their interests are and which places you would like to show them. I certainly had such an experience just recently. My relatives from Innsbruck, Tyrol, visited myself and my family. Until then they had only head that I work in the Museum Aargau at its various sites of the living past. Our first stop that morning was Königsfelden Monastery. Another group was on a tour at the same time as we were. They wanted to use a pendulum to find out exactly where the murder of Albrecht I of Habsburg had taken place. But unfor-

About how Radbot had lost his hawk hunting and found the spot for his new castle while looking for the bird. A bright smile spread across his face. It was a wonderful moment for us all. His enthusiasm infected all of us and the visit was a total success.

> Uncle Max died two years ago. And that makes this memory all the more precious. Whenever I am at Habsburg Castle, I remember him and his happiness that day.

Wine

A very deep red juice gently flows into the round-bodied glass. Your nose is treated to the fragrance of fruity essences mixed with woody overtones. Your eyes close – a first sip. The wine gently trickles down your throat and makes you feel beautifully warm inside.

Albi von Felten: Aargau is full of young, innovative wine-growers who are rocking the Swiss wine scene with their passion and fantastic ideas. Some of the wine-growers are actually in the Swiss "Top 100". Aficionados class their wines as insider tips and the wines are always there or thereabouts in international awards. For me it is really fun when you can serve your top regional cuisine with first-class local wines.



Rapeseed Oil

The rapeseed oil is golden-yellow in a dish. It was gently cold pressed from rape seeds from Aargau's Seetal valley. The fine nutty, slightly buttery taste is an absolute delight when combined with bread.

Albi von Felten: It's the same whatever you are talking about - the quality of the product is decisive. We produce a genuinely top-quality rapeseed oil which has already been awarded gold three times. If you use a really fine rapeseed oil, you will notice the difference immediately in the flavour. And apart from that, rapeseed oil is one of the most valuable and healthy oils worldwide.



Specialities

One jet black, the other golden yellow. Totally different in colour, so different in taste, and yet both so desirable. We are talking about truffles and saffron. The black diamond grows in the idyllic Fricktal valley and the violet crocus in the sweeping Bünztal valley.

Albi von Felten: I love preparing a truffle omelette in truffle season. A simple idea, but the aroma really unfolds with the egg. Another top-quality product is saffron. I like soaking the saffron threads in a little white wine for about half a day before I actually use them in a dish. Beef ragout braised in Aargau red wine is the perfect accompaniment for saffron potato purée. Another of my favourites is a traditional Aargau saffron soup with pieces of trout.



Chocolate

The foil rustles when you open it and the fine smell of cocoa makes your mouth water. The first piece melts on your tongue and mild nutty aromas, paired with fruity sweetness, will delight your taste buds. Chocolate is spiritual soul food.

Albi von Felten: There are plenty of very good, creative chocolatiers in Aargau. We have come up with a "plum stone", a praline made with our own plum schnapps, and also serve a home-made venison bratwurst with high-percentage grandcru chocolate. Insider tip for your BBQ party: slice open a dried plum, fill it with a little high-percentage grand-cru chocolate and then wrap it in a slice of bacon. Grill until crispy on your BBQ in a tray.
